

LIBRARY'S LITTLE HELPERS - The kindergarten class of Sundown ISD has adopted the City of Sundown Library as its annual service project. Veteran teacher Stacey Buchanan approached Director A'ndrea McAdams and asked if they could help the library. It was perfect timing as McAdams was finalizing the Parkhill Building Community grant by adding plants to the front landscaping. On October 7, the two teachers—Buchanan and Jacei Barrera—walked the students a block to the library. Upon arrival, McAdams read a book purchased with the Rob-See-Co grant called "This Little

Kitty in the Garden." The students then went to the "salsa" garden provided by the Parkhill Grant to learn about vegetables: jalapeno, tomatoes, and bell peppers. Looking at the plants from flower stage to fruit stage, the youngsters identified colors as well as the plant cycle. After that, some in the group got their hands dirty in planting while others just watered. Following that, each student helped weed the flowerbed. The group will return for two more subsequent visits to aid the library staff in plant care as well as adding to the Kindness Rock Garden and providing chalk artwork on the patio. 




LUBBOCK, Texas (KCBD) - The American Heart Association is teaming up with the Sundown Library to help close the gaps in rural healthcare. They are debuting a new telehealth hub, providing easier access to doctor's appointments and equipment for Hockley County residents.

In January, the newly-renovated Sundown Library opened up in what used to be a small church. Only months later, there's a new addition to the gaming room, a curtained-off corner designated as the health hub.

Along with a large desk, monitor and web camera, the health hub includes a blood pressure machine and Bluetooth-capable scales and oximeters.

A'ndrea McAdams, the Sundown Library Director, says living in rural West Texas can make it challenging to see a doctor.
